The address of President Hoover in connection with the opening of the new Waldorf-Astoria Hotel on Park Avenue, New York City, will be broadcast from the cabinet room of the White House on this afternoon at 5 o'clock, over WQAI. President Hoover's four minute speech will be heard as part of the special broadcast of the pre-opening program of this great new hotel, which will be heard from 4:45 to 5:30 p. m.

Lucius Boomer, president of the Waldorf-Astoria Corporation, will respond to the President's words. The remainder of the program will be given over to orchestral selections under the direction of Erno Rapee, general musical director of the National Broadcasting Company. The establishment will not be officially opened until October 1.

Guy Robertson, baritone who sang before more than 500,000 persons attending the St. Louis Municipal Opera season during the past summer months, will be heard as guest artist in a new Wednesday series beginning this evening from 7:15 to 7:30 o'clock.

Leonard Joy and his orchestra will be heard also during the series. Robertson will offer his operatic and stage musical hits during each broadcast.

The series, which will be known as "Guy Robertson, baritone," is sponsored by the Brown Shoe Company of St. Louis, Mo.

For the first time since his return from Europe, Percy Grainger, pianist and composer, will be heard on the air Wednesday evening from 7:30 to 8 o'clock over WQAI.

Mr. Grainger will be introduced as the first guest artist on the new series of Mobil Oil Concerts, and will play the Fantasy of Liszt and his own compositions, Country Gardens.

This will be the ninth time that the popular pianist-composer has been heard with the Mobil Oil Concerts during the past two years. Other artists on the program will include Miss Gladys Rice, soprano, a male chorus, an orchestra under the direction of Nataniel Shilkret, and John Holbrook, master of ceremonies.
